That it is the deliberate opinion of this Convention that Silk may be grown in all the United States, not only for somestic purposes, but as a valuable article of comployment to American labour, and retaining millions of dollars in our country, that are: annually sent out of it for the purchase of

silken goods.

Resolved, That a National Silk Journal. the Executive Committee, and all the funds over and above the support of said paper ought to be devoted to the ansancement of the silk cause in the United States.
