PREFATORY NOTE

This Index was prepared under the provisions of Ordinance No. 156 of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, approved June 22, 1906, and covers the period from 1797, the date of the incorporation of the City, to the adjournment of the City Council, on June 14, 1906, both inclusive. More than thirty Ordinances of the session of 1905-6 are not contained in the printed volume issued last year, and hence for them only the number of each Ordinance and the date of its approval by the Mayor have been given herein.

In the case of the Ordinances printed prior to 1906, the page, as well as the number and year, for each has been given. Thus, for instance, Ordinance No. 114, passed in the year 1871 and printed on page 100 of the Ordinances for that year, has been indexed in this manner, viz: 1871/114/100. In the few cases where an Ordinance has had no number the space where such number would have appeared has been marked by a dash.

As to the Resolutions, in each of many years hundreds of these were passed that were of merely transitory interest, as for placing flag-stones, gas-lamps, pumps, etc., or authorizing minor payments. Therefore, while they were properly to be included in any complete Index purporting to cover them, their vast number made it undesirable to give for them more than the year and number of each Resolution, or, where they were not numbered, the month and day of approval in addition to the year. For example, Resolution No. 125 of the year 1888 has been indexed thus: 1888, R. 125; while a Resolution of the year 1821, not numbered, but approved on January 13 of that year and found on page 366 of the volume for that year, has been indicated as follows: 1821, R. (Jan. 13), p. 366. Where there were two or more numbered Resolutions passed in the same year they have been indexed in this way: (*e. g.*), 1854, R. 3, 141.

Where an Ordinance or Resolution has been passed at an extra session of the City Council, this has been shown by placing in parenthesis, after the year of its passage, either the abbreviation

"ex. sess." or the name of the month in which the extra session was begun, thus: 1831 (ex. sess.)/3/316; 1854 (Nov.), R. 7. Where the same session has substantially extended over parts of two years, this has been shown by hyphenating the years (as, 1905-6) where it has appeared that there would be any confusion arising from giving the main year only.

The paging herein given is that of the original printed volumes, except that, when there has been a reprint made (as for the years from 1797 to 1831), the paging of the latter has been followed as being generally more useful and accessible.

In all cases, it has been sought to place an Ordinance or Resolution under the heading where it seemed primarily to belong, and refer to it by such a sub-heading as would afford the best key to its contents in as succinct a form as practicable without being obscure; while numerous cross-references have been added for guidance to such other headings as might also appropriately cover the enactment in question.

In arranging the sub-headings, the chronological plan has been used in the main (although, where there were a number of Ordinances or Resolutions to be placed under the same sub-heading, many or all of them have been grouped together); because it was thought that this system would be the most helpful, not only in tracing the historical development of a subject by the sequence of municipal "statutes" concerning it, but also in finding any particular enactment without special reference to others.

The scope of the Index may be approximately indicated by estimating that there are nearly 2,000 separate headings, with probably 20,000 sub-headings, and perhaps 40,000 primary references, to say nothing of the many hundreds of cross-references.

For the inevitable imperfection in this work, notwithstanding the care and labor expended upon it, the compiler asks such consideration as any who may be disposed to criticise it unduly would wish shown to them under similar circumstances.
