



On April 27th, WMES conducted a routine off-campus evacuation drill. This is

part of the schools' ongoing efforts to provide a safe and orderly learning envi-**Emergency** ronment for students. Besides practice monthly fire evacuation drills, there is also an off-campus evacuation drill. An off-campus evacuation would be nec-

essary if it was determined that the building was unsafe to re-enter. This could be due to fire, gas leak, flooding, etc. Students are transported to the Trappe Fire Hall by buses. Students in Pre-Kindergarten through Grade 2 assemble by homeroom in the upstairs reception hall and students in Grades 3 through 5 assemble by homerooms in the upstairs kitchen area. In the case of a real evacuation, adults would pick up their children at the Fire Hall by reporting to designated sign out supervisors there.
