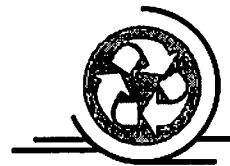

PGCPS TO PROVIDE CHILDREN WITH MEALS THROUGHOUT THE SUMMER MONTHS

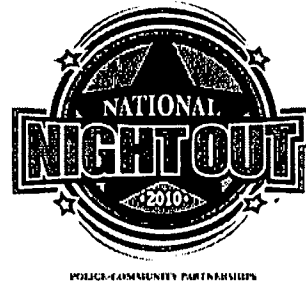
Prince George's County Public Schools (PGCPS) is continuing to sponsor the U.S.

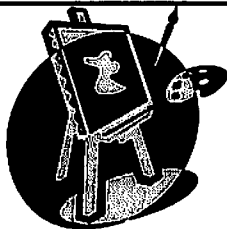

The 2010 Maryland Senior Olympics marks 30 years of playing a major role in helping raise physical fitness awareness for the senior population, aged 50 and above. Along the way, the Maryland games have a deep legacy in the development of the National Senior Games and remains one of the country's top state programs, providing numerous national champions in team and individual sports. Around 2,000 athletes will compete in 17 sports and more than 50 events in this year's Maryland Senior Olympics.

Maryland residency is defined as anyone who resides in the State of Maryland or owns property in the State of Maryland.

To register for the 2010 games, athletes must return a completed application, signed liability release and appropriate fees—all part of this registration kit. Participation in some events is limited. Incomplete registrations will be returned. **There is NO on-site registration for an event.** The Maryland Senior Olympics Individual Participant fees for 2010 are: One event—\$20, 2-3 events —\$30, unlimited—\$50. Deadline for registration is 30 days prior to your first event start date.

Registration after this date will be \$60 per person on a space-available basis. No registrations accepted after Sept. 30, 2010. Additional costs for golf, long-distance running, cycling and bowling will be assessed separately. Team registration is \$100 for 3-on-3 basketball, \$200 for softball and \$175 for volleyball. Captains must complete the Team Registration Form.

All Members of the team must have a valid driver's license on-site to participate in the team events. **Food and Drink: Participants are welcome to bring your own food. The participants are responsible for their own meals.**

All new athletes must attach a copy of a valid state-issued driver's license or MVA ID or proof of eligibility. All athletes must have their driver's license or MVA ID with them at all times during the competition.

Several major developments occurred in the month of June. We continue to process the Brentwood Sunoco gambling bust, as well as move forward with several active illegal drug distribution cases and a prostitution ring in town.



A major burglary on Bunker Hill Rd. was closed by my identification and arrest of the suspect. He had stolen thousands of dollars of TV's, laptops, and credit cards.

Many residents have asked for a Police Database for their valuables. I wish to announce that I now have a database up-and-running for this purpose. To have your valuables and important household items listed, you will need to make a list of the items along with serial numbers and, if you have them, receipts, and have the list notarized. I will then come to your home or office and photograph the items, scan the notarized and any other documentation into the police computer system

and store the information for you. This way, I, and the Police dept., can attest to your possession of the items should that be an issue.

Earlier this month I recovered evidence dropped in Brentwood following the Armored Car Robbery at Safeway in Hyattsville. Should anyone have information regarding this robbery, you can call the Hyattsville Police or Brentwood Police and leave an anonymous message.

The Speed Enforcement Program continues to grow... The average speed is up... to 42 mph! People are still not slowing as much as I would hope they would. Also, the majority of violators are not Brentwood residents, that's a good thing. A second camera is being installed in Rhode Island Ave, across from the Firehouse. Brentwood's camera will pick-up violators coming into Brentwood from Mt. Rainier while Mt. Rainer's camera will operate in the opposite direction. NOTE: The State of Maryland has reduced the speed on that section of R.I. Ave, from 35 down to 25 mph. Please obey the speed limit.

Our Code Enforcement Officer has been busy and doing a great job notifying residents of Code violations. Everyone, please comply by doing what the order asks of you. A clean yard, with trimmed lawn prevents rats, snakes, and other animals from infesting our neighborhood.

Brentwood Police Department Towing Release Policy Change- In the past a *\$75 release fee was paid to the Town of Brentwood/ Police Department and that policy has now been changed. See policy changes below:

To recover an impounded vehicle one must come to Town hall and present their driver's license and proof of ownership of the vehicle. Once the information has

been verified by a law enforcement officer a release receipt will be provided to the owner to present to the towing company. To have your car released from the towing company their towing fees will require settlement before releasing the vehicle to the owner. Please note the towing company fees are set by the towing company, and the Town of Brentwood or the Brentwood Police Department does not get paid towing fees from the tow company. Therefore, the Town of Brentwood or the Brentwood Police Department has no authority to request for towing release fee waivers from the towing company on your behalf.

***All previous \$75 release fees that were collected by the town prior to the new policy change listed above were refunded to the registered vehicle owners. We apologize for any inconvenience this may have caused.**

In its June meetings the Town Council took the following actions :

Approved: Pay bills in the amount of \$23,091.85.

Approved: Set date of June 7th for a Special Meeting to finalize and adopt FY11 budget.

Approved: Introduction and 1st reading of budget ordinance during June 7th Special Meeting.

Approved: "Authorization for the Release of Confidential Medical Information" is to be amended by the Town Attorney to reflect that it is only to be given to the Treasurer/HR Representative.

Approved: "Sick Leave Donation Policy" to be amended to reflect that any confidential medical information given to the Town will be received only by the HR Rep. and that Rep. shall prepare a general report to be submitted to the Mayor & Council in support of the sick leave donation request.

Approved: Town Attorney to review proposed Brentwood Electronics Recycling Partnership (Bladensburg, Colmar Manor, Cottage City, Mt. Rainier, Riverdale Park and University Park) MOU and discuss comments with Town Administrator, with final version to be discussed and voted upon during June 14th Meeting.

Approved: Up to \$1100 to be allocated for summary of FY11 budget to be advertised in a newspaper. Funds to be transferred from (line item 5-1100) Gen Gov - Town Hall Building Maintenance/Supplies and placed in (5-1085) Gen Gov - Printing/Advertising.

Approved: Discontinue use of Vehicle Release forms/fee and issue refunds to those who have paid the fee, to be accompanied by an explanatory cover letter.

Approved: FY11 Budget Ordinance: 2010-01.

Approved: Pay bills in the amount of \$22,806.70.

Approved: Enter into Electronics Recycling MOU with Bladensburg, Colmar Manor, Cottage City, Mount Rainier, Riverdale Park and University Park.

Approved: Changes to the design of the Monument Welcome Signs as presented by Kerley Signs, with changes reflected in the contract.

Approved: Plans for the Outdoor Fitness equipment as presented by the Town Administrator (pending copies of proposals given to Council).

Approved: Discussion of Town Policies tabled to the July Work Session, with a vote to be scheduled for the July Regular Council Meeting.

Approved: Treasurer to submit comprehensive report on FY10 legal bills, to be available to the public by the July Regular Council Meeting.

Approved: Part time Codes position to be extended to July 7, 2010 and PT employee to be on call to July 31st, subject to both Full time and PT employee's availability.

Approved: Establish interim tow release process, with dollar amount, to be finalized in the July Work Session.

Approved: For August, make exception to Charter requirements of 2 meetings per month, due to National Night Out. Only Regular Council Meeting this month.

Approved: Special Ecycling event to be held Saturday June 26th (9am -1pm) for the entire Town, but focusing on seniors and the handicapped.

Approved: Allocation of \$540 to cover overtime for 3 employees during the Ecycling event.

Approved: Allocate \$780 per person for MML Convention expenditures, not to exceed \$2,340, to be taken from (Gen Gov - MML Costs) 5-1190.

Approved: Executive Session to be held Tuesday, June 22, 2010 at 7:30pm to discuss Police Chief Risk Contract, Legal and Personnel issues.

Approved: Special Meeting of the Mayor and Council to be held Wednesday, June 23, 2010.

Approved: Police Chief Risk contract extension to Wednesday, June 23, 2010

Approved: \$75 for flowers to be sent for the Town Attorney's mother's funeral.

Approved: Majority Council approved to solicit other municipalities for a certified speed enforcement officer/official to run the Town's OptoTraffic program.

Approved: Revised Town Clerk Job Description and advertisement to fill Clerk's position.

Approved: \$80 for 2 CMs to attend the Prince George's County Municipal Association (PGCMA) breakfast during the MML Conference.

Approved: The purchase of 1 computer for the Treasurer's use and provide specifications in Council Packet with vote in July meeting.

Approved: Staff to work but Town Hall closed for public business on Thursday, June 24, 2010 due to Special Election.

Approved: To hold a special meeting/swearing-in ceremony on Thursday, July 8th at 7:30 pm

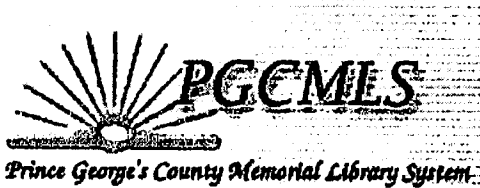

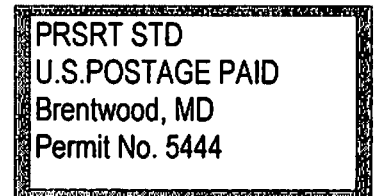
