A LETTER FROM THE DIRECTOR

People often think of public libraries as just places to store and borrow books, but the real work of public libraries is expanding access and opportunities. Our new motto (community + opportunity) and logo celebrate the important role our libraries play in connecting our patrons with opportunities to improve and expand their lives and the lives of their families and neighbors. In the past year, we maintained our vigorous focus on increasing access to library services, developing and reaching new audiences, and improving and enhancing library facilities.

We offered additional programs during FY 2016, increasing the number from 355 to 431. Accordingly, our program attendance increased by 1,466 people, from 6,409 to 7,875. Our adult events included harp concerts, gardening classes taught by University of Maryland Extension, book discussion groups, and participation in the One Maryland One Book project again. The 2015 OMOB selection - *The Boys in the Boat* by Daniel James Brown – proved to be immensely popular.

Our STEM activities with children increased as well. We participated in the Maryland STEM Festival in November, offering events at all branches. Children enjoyed the opportunity to create Stop-motion Lego movies and build with Duplo blocks. We added a LEGO Club that meets monthly at the Oakland Library, and for the first time, we held a Summer Reading Club Kick-off event at the Oakland and Grantsville libraries in June.

We are proud that our libraries remain a vital and integral part of the Garrett County community. The staff of the Ruth Enlow Library looks forward to continuing to provide excellent library service to Garrett County residents.

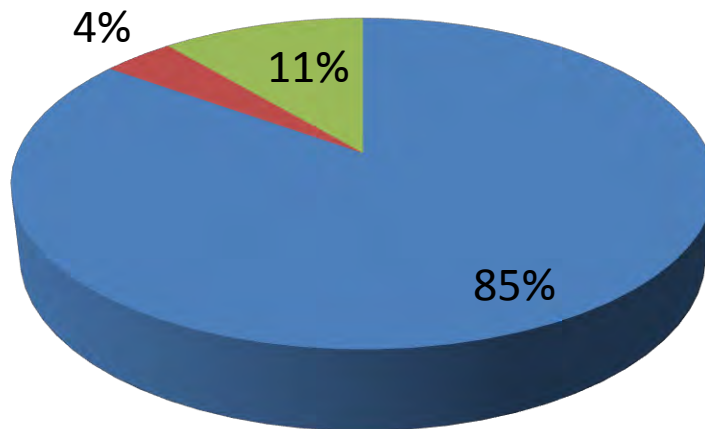

NUMBER OF PROGRAMS: 431 FY 2016

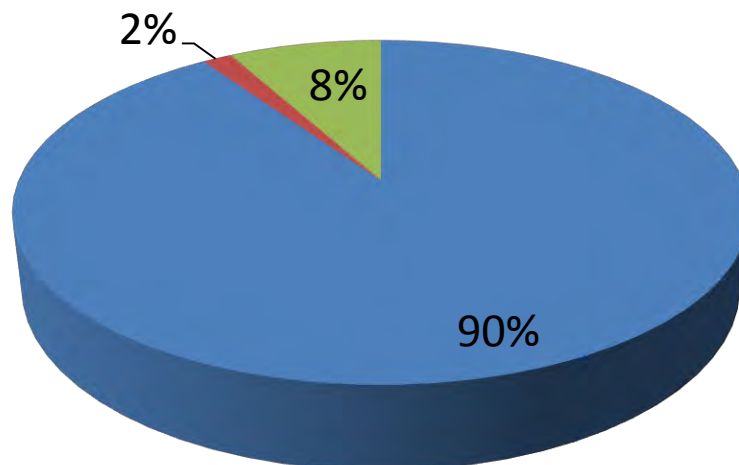

Program Attendance: 7,875

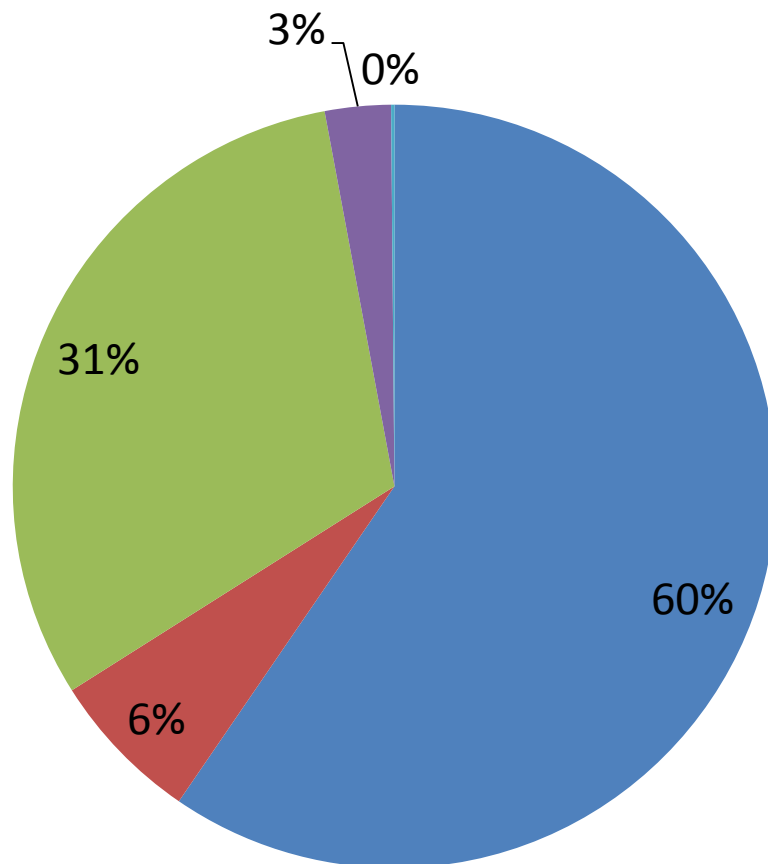

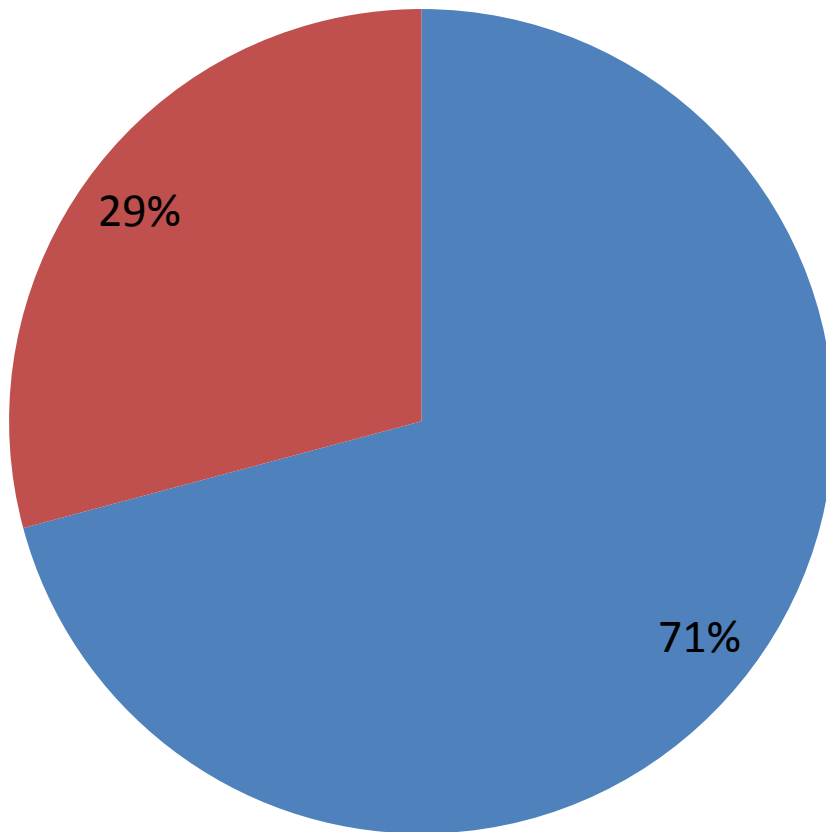

■ Juvenile: 70,807

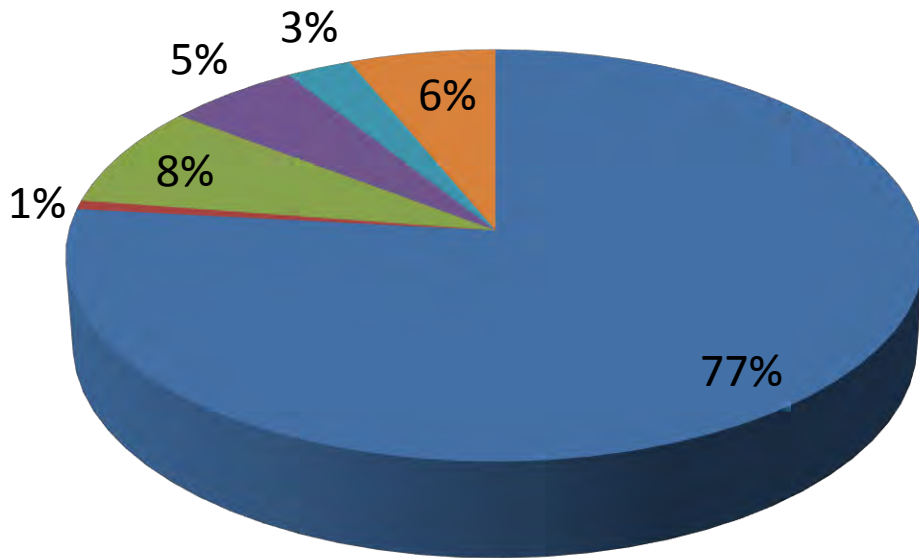
