FOREWORD

High school graduates have multiple opportunities open to them to continue their education in the State of Maryland. The programs—a series of courses arranged in a scope and sequence which lead to a degree or a certificate—are designed to meet a wide variety of personal and community needs, and they offer to the students a broad spectrum of choice enabling them to enroll in (1) Community Colleges, (2) Four-Year Colleges or (3) Universities.

The Maryland Council for Higher Education has the responsibility of developing a MASTER PLAN FOR HIGHER EDUCATION IN MARYLAND in order to provide an effective instrument for planning the expansion of higher education in the State. This inventory of programs currently available in institutions of higher education in Maryland is essentially a status report, and, as such, it is vital to the evolving Master Plan. This information is indispensable in efforts to project the types of programs required to meet the post-high school needs of the citizens of the State in the decades ahead. The reader will find information on programs in all segments of the tripartite structure—the Community Colleges, the four-year colleges, and the universities, both public and private.

Nearly all of the institutions responded to the initial questionnaire sent out in the Spring of 1967 as well as to the additional inquiries which are a part of the Council's Institutional Long-Range Planning Project. The implementation of the Master Plan makes it necessary that program information be sought from all colleges and universities within the state in order to provide for the most effective and efficient utilization of resources.

Although the Council prepared this report for its own use, it is aware of the multiple uses to which it may be put. High school counselors should find it helpful in answering some of the questions posed by seniors as they consider the alternatives open to them in the furtherance of their education. Parents and adults in general desire to know what programs are available at higher education institutions. Educators throughout the State need to be aware of program developments in all institutions of higher education in order to increase the general effectiveness of educational planning. Finally, state officials use such information as this publication contains in providing overall support for higher education.

The general spirit of cooperation which has existed between the Council and the institutions in both the public and the private sectors greatly facilitated the preparation of this publication. The Council appreciates the prompt response received from the many correspondents in the State's colleges and universities. Continuing cooperation will make possible a periodic updating of the information about programs available in Maryland institutions.

SECTION I

PROGRAMS IN THE TWO YEAR COLLEGES

Distribution and Multi-Purposes of Two Year Colleges

There are sixteen two year colleges—Community or Junior Colleges—in Maryland, twelve of them are public and four are private. The public institutions are distributed throughout the State, thereby placing the opportunity to continue education beyond the high school within the grasp of nearly all of the citizens. The specific locations of these institutions are indicated in the Appendix of this publication.

An analysis of the student body at a given Community College will reveal that students are in attendance for the following purposes:

- To transfer to four year colleges after their first two years;
- To pursue occupational career programs prerequisite to placement in the labor market;
- To develop the skills and abilities which will enable them to render broader community service;
- To broaden their general education backgrounds in order to effect more satisfying adjustment to contemporary life;
- To secure some developmental and remedial experiences in order to strengthen themselves in areas of academic weakness; and,
- To receive some desired guidance in matters of educational, personal and social concern.

Admissions Policy of Community Colleges

The wide variety of programs offered by the Community Colleges makes it feasible for these institutions to employ what is generally known as an “open door” admissions policy. While not every student may meet the specific academic requirements for entrance into the *Transfer Program*, practically everyone can find a program suitable to both his interests and his stage of academic preparation. It is also quite possible for a student to enter one program and, later, transfer to still another one. The extensive personal guidance which is available is instrumental in assisting the students to make such decisions. The flexibility of the programs of the Community Colleges enables it, perhaps more so than other institutions of higher education, to offer “something for everyone”.

Kinds of Information Contained on Charts in This Publication

The information contained on the charts of this report indicate the specific programs which are available and programs which are projected, the institutions which offer the programs, the length of time successful pursuit of the programs requires and the awards which are given following the successful completion of the programs.

Length of Programs

The multi-purpose character of the Community College is reflected in the variety of programs it offers and in the length of time required to complete successfully any given program. Some programs are offered for a period of six weeks; still others require a study period of six months or a year; and, finally, many programs must be pursued for a period as long as two years. in the outlying parts of the State.

Status of Programs

The direct response of the Community College to a host of community needs results in the introduction of a program at a given time and the withdrawal of that program as soon as the need of the community for it is satisfied. Other programs have been projected to begin during a particular school year. The indications in the tables concerning the status of the programs are as follows:

- O – The program is *operational* at the time of the publication of this inventory.
- P – The program is being *planned* or projected by the institution.
- P-69 – The program has been *projected* by the institution to begin in the year 1969, for example.

When in doubt about the status of a program, however, accurate information can be secured by means of a contact with the offices of the Dean or the Registrar of the institution in question.

Awards

Students who complete successfully the programs of a Community College are eligible to receive official certification of their accomplishment from the institution. These awards are stepping stones for immediate entry into some occupational pursuits and for the continuance of their education in the four year college. The awards are indicated on the charts as follows:

- A - The Associate in Arts degree which is awarded after the completion of the Transfer Program, and it is commonly referred to as the AA degree.
- C - A Certificate is awarded after the successful completion of an occupational career program.

The student who pursues a transfer curriculum leading to the Associate in Arts degree actually intends to continue his education in a four year college, and he transfers to that institution after completing the first two years in the Community College. The student may also receive a Certificate for completing programs other than occupational career programs. Some of these programs are designed to enable the student to render types of community service as suggested in programs such as Civil Defense, First Aid, Neighborhood Organization and the like. Finally, many students pursue courses which are not parts of a particular scope and sequence which lead to either the degree or the certificate. The availability of such courses attests to the capacity of the Community College for meeting a wide variety of personal and community needs.

SECTION II

PROGRAMS IN THE PUBLIC AND PRIVATE FOUR YEAR COLLEGES

Distribution of Four Year Colleges

There are twenty-seven four-year colleges in Maryland, eight of them are public and nineteen are private. These institutions are located throughout the state in such a way that they are accessible to every citizen desiring to continue his education. The specific locations of these institutions are indicated in the Appendix of this publication.

Admissions Policies of Maryland Four-Year Colleges and Masters Degree Programs

The selection of students is generally based upon the students' achievement in their high school studies, recommendations by their high school principals, and their performance on college entrance examinations. Each college reserves the right to close admissions at any given point for a variety of reasons such as limited dormitory, laboratory and classroom space, the availability of qualified faculty and supporting personnel, the relative standing of a given student in his class, and so forth. The college catalogs usually contain statements to clarify the admissions policies of the institutions. The high school counselors are able to provide further information about admissions policies.

Admission to graduate and professional schools is contingent upon the quality of the undergraduate record and the fulfillment of specific program and course prerequisites.

Kinds of Information Contained on Charts in This Publication

The kinds of information about programs in four-year colleges on the charts of this publication parallel the information available on the Community Colleges. Information is provided on length of programs, status of programs and awards.

Length of Programs

In normal procedure a bachelor's degree is awarded following a period of four years' full-time study. The master's degree is generally earned by the accumulation of thirty additional semester credits beyond the bachelor's degree. Some colleges refer to this as the fifth year, that is, four years required for earning the bachelor's degree and an additional year in which the student earns the master's degree.

Status of Programs

The colleges frequently review their programs of study and new ones are added from time to time to meet changing student and professional

needs. The present status of the programs listed in this publication is indicated as follows:

- O — The program is *operational* at the time of the publication of this inventory.
- P — The Program is being *planned* by the institution.
- P-69 — The program has been *projected* by the institution for a particular school *year*, for example, 1969.

Additional information about any particular program in an individual institution may be secured by means of a contact with the Dean's office.

Awards

The successful completion of the programs of the four year college results in the awarding of the following degrees:

- B.S. — The Bachelor of Science degree
- B.A. — The Bachelor of Arts degree
- M.S. — The Master of Science degree
- M.A. — The Master of Arts degree

Generally speaking, each program leading to the bachelor's degree is composed of two principal groups of courses, general studies and the courses required in the field in which the student chooses to major. Courses in the major field, for the most part, are scheduled in the junior and senior years.

SECTION III

PROGRAMS AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND AND THE JOHNS HOPKINS UNIVERSITY

The Scope of a University

The scope of the University of Maryland, as well as that of The Johns Hopkins University, reflects society's deepest concerns about the vast knowledge in all fields which mankind has accumulated. The university provides opportunities for intensive preparation in a multitude of areas. The capacity to house all of these programs in various schools and departments of one institution is attributable to the distinctive charge and commitment of a university to offer the broadest possible range of disciplines to its students. The university is the one institution of higher education which provides bachelor's, master's and doctoral degrees in practically all of the disciplines of the undergraduate institution—the college—but also these same degrees are available for the successful completion of work in a myriad of interdisciplinary combinations and in highly specialized areas.

University Departments and Schools

The universities have all of the more traditional departments from the Department of Art through the Department of Zoology, for example. One not only finds university departments very similar to those which are typical of the colleges, but also departments which by design are focused upon interdisciplinary study, a biochemistry department, for example. Above and beyond that, however, one can find in a university separate schools, e.g., School of Commerce or Business Administration, School of Medicine, School of Law, School of Fine Arts and Humanities, which provide both the basic and the advanced education which lead to the professional degrees in medicine, engineering, law, drama, music and so forth.

Major Areas of Specialization

It is the university alone which provides the student the maximum opportunity to secure the highest degree of specialization in almost any aspect of a major field of knowledge. For example, a student at the University of Maryland may enroll in the College of Agriculture in its Department of Agronomy. If he were to do so, the major fields of specialization open to him are Crop Breeding, Forage Management, Turf Management, Weed Control, Tobacco Production, Soil Classification and Mineralogy, Soil Chemistry and Fertility and Soil Physics.

Length of Programs

Under normal circumstances, four years are required to earn the bachelor's degree; five years are required for the master's and the doctor's degree can be earned with a minimum of three year's of full-time study beyond the bachelor's degree. In spite of the preceding statements, it is difficult to state flatly just what the time requirements are for the graduate degrees particularly inasmuch as graduate work at a given university is as distinctive as the particular institution itself. Furthermore, the quality of the student's work is a major consideration in graduate programs. Grades of "C", for example, are seldom if ever acceptable in doctoral programs and only to a limited extent in master's programs. Precise information on these points must be secured through contacts with the university of one's choice. It is presumed, however, that by the time a student acquires the status of a graduate student, he will have acquired sufficient knowledge of the academic processes to know precisely where to secure the information he needs to promote his further academic progress.

BRANCH IN BALTIMORE COUNTY**

The University of Maryland, Baltimore County Campus (UMBC), began classes in September 1966 as a campus for commuting students.

The 1966-67 academic year was devoted to the teaching of courses normally taken by freshmen students and the initiation of graduate courses for part-time students. Since then, steps have been taken to expand the undergraduate offerings to encompass the full four-year course range for the programs offered.

The UMBC Graduate Center initiated graduate courses in engineering during the 1966-67 school year and is developing programs for which there is demonstrated area need and in which adequate enrollment can be expected.

Programs offered at the UMBC campus fall under the following divisions: Division of Humanities, Division of Mathematics, Division of Sciences, and the Division of Social Sciences.
