DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

Fiscal year 2021 began in a time of uncertainty. Libraries were beginning to reopen and welcome returning patrons, while still providing virtual programming, curbside services, and developing new ways to reach their communities. We held our first virtual Summer Reading Program and increased social media engagement. Behind the scenes, we installed plexiglass and implemented protocols to keep the staff and public safe.

Patrons returned to the building in early October for printing and computer usage, but State mandates pushed us back to curbside services until late February. Everyone was weary and the staff and community missed each other immensely, but we did not give up. Instead, we took the library beyond the physical buildings. Staff members attended events, distributed crafts kits, began circulating mobile hot spots, participated in Story Times, disseminated health information to the public, created a TikTok account, and even celebrated the Icelandic tradition of Jolabokaflod by gifting books to patrons.

We persevered, and by May the Central Branch was opened to the public again with normal hours restored by June. The Hurlock Branch followed closely behind and hopes to return to normal hours soon. I have never been more proud of the staff and community than I am now. We showed resiliency, creativity, and dedication like never before and changed librarianship forever.
