Reduction of Outstanding Arrest Warrants

(HB 1259, Chapter 683, Acts 2000)

This annual report was prepared in response to language contained in HB 1259, (Chapter 683, Acts 2000). Specifically, the language directs:

"That the Motor Vehicle Administration, in consultation with the primary law enforcement officers in the State that provide information to the Administration under Section 1 of this Act regarding individuals named in outstanding arrest warrants, shall report to the General Assembly pursuant to § 2-1246 of the State Government Article by October 1, 2002 and each year thereafter on the effectiveness of this Act in reducing the number of outstanding arrest warrants in those jurisdictions that provide arrest warrant information to the Administration."

This Act directed that the Maryland Department Of Transportation Motor Vehicle Administration (MDOT MVA) suspend an individual's driver's license and refuse to register or transfer the registration of the individual's vehicles if the individual is named in an outstanding arrest warrant (OAW). The legislation specifically says that the program is optional for local police agencies. Despite this, the MDOT MVA has reached out to State and local law enforcement agencies on numerous occasions, initially working to design and subsequently modify the program and acquaint police officers with the program benefits and operation.

The MDOT MVA worked with the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services to develop an automated interaction between the OAW Program and the current Maryland Telecommunications Enforcement Resource System (METERS) used by law enforcement. Law enforcement agencies who are participants in the OAW program no longer need to enter the warrant information into two separate systems, thus eliminating duplicative steps. All law enforcement agencies are aware of this service.

Since the program's inception on December 1, 2001, 54 law enforcement agencies, approximately 19% of all law enforcement agencies in Maryland, have either participated or enrolled to participate. Although Maryland State Police (MSP) is one agency, there are 23 MSP Barracks that participate and report separately. As one might expect, the number of outstanding warrants that are reported by the participating law enforcement agencies, the number of suspensions imposed by the MDOT MVA, and the number of warrants that are satisfied are all increasing, while relative relationships between those numbers remain fairly consistent. Interestingly, several jurisdictions that did not report any new warrants in the past year still saw increases in warrants satisfied, indicating that the program continues to work, even on old warrants.

In monitoring the branch activity, the 2020 calendar-year overall "false positive" rate was 47%. This is the first time the false positive rate has dipped below 50% since the MDOT MVA began tracking this statistic. Although this is a slight overall decrease, the two (2) police agencies with the highest false positive rates have made significant progress in clearing their satisfied warrants from the MDOT MVA's system. In calendar-year 2019, the false positive rate for each agency was approximately 59%, and in calendar-year 2020 their rates were 41% and 31%.
