

\$200 REWARD.

RANAWAY from the first of the undersigned subscribers, living near Barren Creek Springs in Somerset county, on Saturday the 20th of June instant, negro man named DANIEL, commonly called Brown, the slave of Thomas Cooper minor. Daniel is about 25 years of age, five feet seven or eight inches high, and a bright mulatto. Has no scars that are recollected, and his clothing is not known. It is thought he will make his way to Philadelphia where it is believed his father resides.



Also negro GEORGE the slave of the last mentioned of the undersigned, living in the same neighborhood. George originally came out of the Cooper family, and was recently purchased of J. D. Robertson. He is the brother of Daniel, about 20 years of age—dark complexion, much more so than his brother, almost black, five feet seven or eight inches high—clothing not remembered. George ranaway in March, but remained in the neighborhood till his brother absconded as is supposed; and it is believed that both have now gone off together.

The undersigned will respectively give fifty dollars for the apprehension of his slave in the State if secured so that he may get him again, and one hundred dollars for either of them apprehended out of the State and secured as aforesaid; that is to say, one hundred dollars for both, caught within the State, and secured so that the owners get them; and two hundred dollars if taken out of the State and secured as aforesaid.
