

State of Maryland, to wit. Whereas a certain William Austin has been committed to the Jail of Baltimore County, upon a charge jointly with George S. Cordery of having stolen from Mrs. Jones two one hundred dollar Bank Notes and thirty or forty dollars in Silver. And whereas the said William Austin has been recommended to Executive Clemency by many respectable Citizens of Baltimore who state him to be a boy of about eighteen years of age, and to have sustained a fair character previous to the present charge.

Now, therefore, I James Thomas Governor of the State of Maryland, do hereby grant a full Pardon to the said William Austin, on account of the aforesaid offence, upon payment of the costs accrued upon said charge, upon the condition that the said William Austin shall go to Sea within two Weeks after his discharge, and continue in either the public or merchant service as a Seaman for three years, without being during that time within this State more than three months at any one time, and order and direct that all further proceedings against him on the charge aforesaid, do cease and determine, upon payment of the costs aforesaid, and that no further prosecution be had or carried on against him for, or on account of said offence, provided said conditions be complied with, but this instrument to be null and void upon the violation of said conditions. State of Maryland, to wit. Whereas a certain John A. O'Reilly was convicted of Indictment in and Arundel County Court, at a April term one thousand eight hundred and thirty one of a kidnapping a negro woman to run away, and sentenced to six years confinement in the Penitentiary. And whereas the said John A. O'Reilly has been recommended to the Clemency of the Governor, by many respectable Citizens of Arundel County, on condition of his leaving the State within sixty days from the date hereof, and never again returning within its limits.

Now, therefore, I James Thomas Governor of Maryland, have thought fit to Pardon the said John A. O'Reilly, on condition of his leaving the State within sixty days from the date and never returning within its limits, and I do hereby direct that the said John A. O'Reilly be immediately released from imprisonment on account of said offence, and grant him a Pardon therefor, on the aforesaid conditions, to be void upon their violation.
