Now, therefore, pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and laws of the United States in such case made and provided for, I do hereby request that the said John Kemp be apprehended and delivered to Judson W. Richardson, Sheriff of Prince Georges County, who is hereby authorized to receive and convey him to the State of Maryland, there to be dealt with according to law.

Richardson Sheriff of Prince Georges County, who is hereby authorized to receive and convey him to Maryland, there to be dealt with according to law.
