

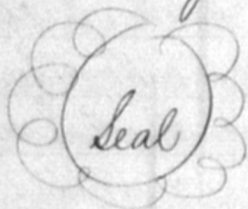
State of Maryland, to wit:

Ives be apprehended and delivered to Judson A. Richardson Sheriff of Prince Georges County aforesaid, who is hereby authorized to receive and convey him to the State of Maryland, there to be dealt with according to Law.

Wm. Brown a certain William Brown negro slave of John E. Bowie of Prince Georges County, negro slave stands charged with the crime of enticing slaves to run away from their masters.

William Lee William Lee negro slave of Charles E. Eversfield of Prince Georges County stands charged with the crimes of enticing and persuading slaves to run away from their masters and with stealing two mules.

Henry Norton a certain Henry Norton negro slave of Thomas Brown of Prince Georges County stands charged with the crime of assisting slaves to run away from their masters

Now therefore, pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and Laws of the United States in such case made and provided, I do hereby request that the said Perry Brooks be apprehended and delivered to David E. Hopkins Sheriff of said County, who is hereby authorized to receive and convey him to the State of Maryland there to be dealt with according to law.
