 Parties & traversed. Party returned to assist the prosecution. Plea Not Guilty. Trial by his country. Jury empanelled & sworn. May 7th 1862, Verdict Guilty. 1862 May 14th Party returned to be confined in the Penitentiary of the State of Maryland for 8 years from the 14th day of May 1869. The execution of the sentence in N^o 2 Presentments Pardon'd by the Gov. of Maryland on the 7th day 1865 as per order filed.
