

AFFAIRS IN MONTGOMERY COUNTY.—The Rockville (Md.) Journal states that the wheat in that county does not present a promising appearance, though it has improved within a few days. The Journal has also the following items:

Mortality.—There has been a very great mortality on the river, from Seneca Mills down, for several weeks past. Most of the deaths have resulted from Pneumonia. There are a great many yet very ill, with slight hope of recovery.

Wild Pigeons.—Hundreds of gangs of wild pigeons, in their migratory course, have passed through our county. As yet, few have been shot. Robins are in great abundance.

Sad Accident.—A son of Mr. A. F. Boswell, aged about 2 years, fell into a tub of scalding water on the 20th inst., and was so severely burned as to die on the following morning.

Guano.—A large quantity of Guano has been brought into our county for Spring use.
