

William Caulk? Both Remembers that on the seventh
 day of July in the year of our Lord one
 thousand eight hundred and forty one the
 following Bill of Sale or Instrument of writing was recited to be
 recorded and was accordingly enrolled as follows to wit: Whereas
 William Caulk of Talbot County in the State of Maryland has
 by Deed of Manumission bearing date the second day of July of
 the present year duly executed acknowledged and recorded according
 to law liberated and set free among others the following negroes
 to wit: a negro man named Sam Green a negro woman named
 Mary Moore a negro boy named John Moore a negro girl
 named July Ann Green a negro boy named Frank Joshua
 and a negro boy named Henry Joshua to take effect upon
 their arrival respectively to the ages of thirty six years re-
 specting to himself in the mean time the use and services
 of the said negroes and has also in the said Deed fixed
 and determined the state and condition of the issue which
 may be born of the female negroes in the said deed mentioned
 on or before their arrival respectively to the ages of thirty
 six years as aforesaid. Now know all men by these pres-
 ents that the said William Caulk for and in consideration
 of the sum of Five hundred dollars current money to him
 in hand paid by John W Kemp who is now and for more
 than one year last passed has been a bona fide resident of
 the State of Maryland the receipt whereof he doth hereby
 acknowledge hath bargained sold assigned and transferred
 and by these presents doth bargain sell assign and trans-
 fer unto the said John W Kemp his executors adminis-
 trators and assigns all his the said William Caulk's right
 and interest in and to the said negroes for and during
 the period or term of servitude by him reserved as aforesaid
 that is to say from the date hereof until the said negroes
 shall respectively attain the ages of thirty six years and also
 in and to the issue to be born of the female negroes above
 named during the period or term of their servitude as
 aforesaid for and during the periods or terms as fixed
 and determined by him as mentioned and stated in the
 said above recited Deed of Manumission. To Have and
 to Hold all the right and interest of him the said
 William Caulk in and to the said negroes for and
 during the aforesaid terms of servitude to be by him reserved
 and hereby bargained and sold to the said John W
 Kemp his executors administrators and assigns together
 with all and every of the issue which the above named
