William Caulk It is remembered that on the seventh
 day of July in the year of our Lord
 Joseph Caulk one thousand eight hundred and forty
 one, the following Bill of Sale or Instrument of writing was
 received to be recorded and was accordingly enrolled as follows
 to wit: Whereas William Caulk of Talbot County in the
 State of Maryland has by Deed of Manumission bearing
 equal date with these presents duly executed acknowledged
 and recorded according to law liberated and set free among
 others the following negroes to wit: a negro woman named
 Fido Green a negro boy named George Green a negro
 boy named James Green a negro girl named Eliza Green
 a negro girl named Ellen Green a negro girl named
 Matilda Green and a negro man named Thosby Sharpe to
 take effect upon their arrival respectively to the age
 of thirty one years; reserving to himself in the meantime
 the use and services of the said negroes; and has also in
 the said Deed fixed and determined the State and Con-
 dition of the issue which may be born of the female
 negroes in the said Deed mentioned on or before their
 arrival respectively to the age of thirty two years as
 aforesaid. Now know all men by these presents that
 the said William Caulk for and in consideration of the
 sum of Two hundred dollars current money to him
 in hand paid by Joseph Caulk who is now and for
 more than one year last pasted has been a bona fide
 resident of the State of Maryland the receipt whereof
 he doth hereby acknowledge hath bargained sold
 assigned and transferred and by these presents doth
 bargain sell assign and transfer unto the said Joseph
