The report of J. C. W. Penell, trustee appointed by a
decree in this cause to make sale of certain negroes therein
mentioned, respectfully shews:

That after giving bond, with security approved
by this court, for the faithful performance of his trust
as required by the said decree, your Trustee as therein
directed did proceed to offer the said negroes at
private sale and pursuant thereto did sell the said
negroes for cash to William J. Trippe, at the prices and

matism, at and for the price or sum of eight hundred

six dollars and thirty two cents - which several sums of

Eight hundred and seventy six dollars and thirty two cents.

Your trustee further states that in compliance with
the order in the said decree, he hath allowed and paid
from the proceeds of said sale, to William J. Trippe, his
account against N. W. Trippe for the sum of eighteen
hundred and seventy six dollars and thirty two cents,
filed in this cause, and the said account with the
receipt of Wm. J. Trippe thereon is herewith returned to this Court.
