This Indenture made this twenty first day of December in the year eighteen hundred & thirty seven. In witness that Melissa Fisher (a free woman of colour) of Caroline County hath put out and placed and by these presents doth put and bind out her son Alford Fisher who on the twenty third day of June next will be four years old as an apprentice to Alexander Jump to learn the art and mystery of farming, the said Alford Fisher after the manner of an apprentice to dwell with and serve the said Alexander Jump from the day of the date hereof until the twenty third day of June eighteen hundred & fifty five, at which time the said apprentice will be twenty one years of age during all which time the said apprentice, his master well and faithfully shall serve, his secrets keep and do his lawfull command. obey he shall do no damage to his said master nor wilfully suffer any to be done by others and if any to his knowledge be intended he shall give his said master reasonable notice thereof he shall not waste the Goods of his said master nor lend them unlawfully to any, nor matrimony contracts during the said term
