


Hold the said Lot, piece or parcel of land with the buildings and appurtenances thereunto belonging to him the said Henry E. Layman, his heirs and assigns forever.

Be it remembered that on this 3rd day of December A.D. 1885, there was brought to be recorded among the Land Records of Kent County, a deed, which is in the words following, to wit:
This deed made this second day of December in the year eighteen hundred and eighty five between James A. Jones, James Bentley, William Perkins, William M. Jones, William J. Hemby, Edward Miller, Lorenzo Furn and Thomas Wright of Kent County in the State of Maryland trustees formerly of the Methodist Episcopal church of the colored people of Chestertown, and afterward, to wit, after building the new church on the suburbs of said town, trustees of James Methodist Episcopal church, parties of the first part, and James A. Jones, James Bentley, William Perkins, Edward Miller, Thomas Wright, Thomas Jones, Benjamin Ringgold, James
