



This Indenture made the Twenty first Day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand Seven hundred and forty six Between William Sellman of Annarundel County Planter of the one part and Joseph Cowman of the Same County Merchant of the other part Witnesseth that the Said W^m. Sellman for and in Consideration of the Sum of fifty Six Pounds Eighteen Shillings and three pence Current money and fourteen Shillings & ten pence Sterling to him the Said W^m. Sellman in hand paid by the Said Joseph Cowman before the en sealing & delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged he the Said W^m. Sellman hath given granted bargained and sold and by these presents doth give grant bargain & Sell unto the said Joseph Cowman ~~his~~ his Executors administrators or assigns one negro Man called Stephen one negro Woman called Pleasance and one negro Man called Ned To have and to hold the said negroes to him the Said Joseph Cowman his Executors administrators and assigns to and for the proper use of him the Said Joseph Cowman his Executors administrators and assigns for ever Provided always. and it is the true intent & meaning of these presents that if the Said W^m. Sellman his Executors administrators or assigns shall well and truly pay or cause to be paid ~~unto~~ to the Said Joseph Cowman the said Sums of fifty Six pounds Eighteen Shillings and three pence Current money and fourteen Shillings and ten pence Sterling at or before the first Day of December Next with Legall Interest for the Same and the Charge of Drawing & recording this mortgage then this Deed of bargain & Sale shall become void and of no Effect and the Said W^m. Sellman for himself his Executors administrators ~~and assigns~~ doth covenant to and with the Said Joseph Cowman his Executors administrators & assigns that he the Said W^m. Sellman his Ex^{ors} or adm^{rs} shall & will well & truly

pay to the said Joseph Cowman his Executors Administrators and assigns the af-
sumy of fifty six Pounds Eighteen Shillings & three pence Current money and fourteen
Shillings and ten pence Sterling with legal Interest for the Same on the first Day of
December next ensuing the Date hereof In Witness whereof the parties to these
presents have hereunto Interchangeably set their hands & affixed their seals the
