Jan<sup>y</sup> the 9<sup>th</sup> 1715 Then came Simon Larkin before me Josiah  
 Wilson one of his Majesty Justices for prince Georges County and made Oath  
 that he saw the above named John Blackmore sign and acknowledge the above  
 power of atty and that the other Evidence viz<sup>t</sup> Richard Stanney and John  
 Stewards were present at same time Sworn before Josiah Wilson

Jan<sup>y</sup> 20<sup>th</sup> 1715 Came John Stewards and made Oath on the Holy  
 Evangelist that he saw the within named John Blackmore sign seal and  
 Deliver the within Power of atty to Catherine Shipp  
 at 1/2 1/2 p<sup>o</sup>  
 Jural Coram me Th<sup>o</sup> Larkin

Richard Moore of Philadelphia marks his Cattle and hogs in Maryland as  
 follows - a crop and a hole in the left Ear and a crop and two Slits in the  
 Right November 4<sup>th</sup> 1715

This Indenture made the fourteenth day of September An<sup>o</sup> Dom<sup>o</sup>  
 one Thousand seven hundred and fifteen Between Thomas Stocket of  
 Anne Arundell County in y<sup>e</sup> province of Maryland of the one parte and  
 Samuel Chambers of the said County and province of the other parte  
 Witnesseth and that the said Thomas Stocket for & in consideration  
 of the Sum of Thirty five pounds Sterl: to him in hand paid the  
 Rec<sup>t</sup> Whereof he the said Tho: Stocket Doth hereby Acknowledge  
 And Doth hereby acquit Exonerate & Discharge him the said Sam<sup>l</sup>  
 Chambers his heirs and Assigns for ever Hath given granted Aliene  
 Bargain Sold Enfeoffed and confirmed and Doth by these presents  
 Give Grant Aliene Bargain Enfeoffe and Confirm unto him the  
 said Sam<sup>l</sup> Chambers his heirs and Assigns for ever All that parcel of  
 Land being part of a Tract of Land called the Obligation Beginning  
 at an old bounded Poplar being the Northeasternmost bounded tree of  
 Larkins Hills and running from thence South west eight perches to a small  
 branch thence with the said branch north twenty degrees and a half west by  
 fifty six p<sup>o</sup> to a young bounded white Oak in the said branch thence north  
 forty nine deg<sup>s</sup> west thirty four p<sup>o</sup> to a marked Oak in the said branch  
 thence north and by East fifty two p<sup>o</sup> to a bounded Hickory thence North  
 thirty six deg<sup>s</sup> East to a bounded Oak of a tract of Land called Bosenton  
 and running with Bosenton by a line drawn South and by East one hundred  
 seventy p<sup>o</sup> thence with a straight Line to y<sup>e</sup> first Tree containing and Land out  
 together with all Rights profits
