I the said M<sup>rs</sup> Moore of God's house I M<sup>rs</sup> Moore being  
sick and weak of body but of sound and perfect memory  
do by this bond and consent of my dear husband M<sup>r</sup> Moore  
make this my last will and testament in manner and  
form following

I the said M<sup>rs</sup> Moore do give and bequeath to my daughter Susanna Mitchell  
that tract or parcels of land called Greenwood which was  
bought in my Widowhood of Geo: Gaby lying in Calo County  
now former George's County West side of plantation Road  
containing and laid out for three hundred Acre Relation being had  
by patent and conveyed both word at large appeared to  
be enjoyed by her and the heirs of her body lawfully begotten  
for ever but if no such heirs be or my wife and devise that the  
said tract of land be equally divided between my sonns Jerry  
& Charly Burgess to be enjoyed by them & their heirs lawfully  
begotten for ever but if both my sd. sonns dyd without such  
lawfull issue then I give & bequeath it to George Burgess  
son of George Burgess & to his heirs for ever

I the said M<sup>rs</sup> Moore do give and bequeath to my daughter Susanna Mitchell  
that tract or parcels of land called Westfield  
lying in Caloort County now former George's County West  
side of plantation Road containing and laid out for three hundred Acre  
bought in  
my Widowhood of Geo: Gaby in my will and devise  
that it may be enjoyed of in manner and form following  
I request & desire my dear husband M<sup>r</sup> Moore to dispose of  
& sell the said tract of land called Westfield and with  
money that shall receive for it to buy four Negroes  
which I desire of as followeth one to my son Jerry  
Burgess one to my son Charly Burgess one to my daughter Susanna  
Mitchell & one to my son Rich Moore

I request And drew my deare husband the forty and five of  
fifty pounds to y<sup>e</sup> p<sup>er</sup>son whose name is written in the receipt  
as to the use of my last will

- Five pounds to George Burgess to be laid out in what of health.
- Five pounds to be laid out to Edward Burgess
- Five pounds to be laid out to Susanna Biddle

I I do with y<sup>e</sup> liberty & consent of my dear husband and  
Beneath unto the said Will for his care and health and good  
father and furniture with all things belonging to it  
Lastly I do hereby make and declare all former Wills made  
before by me made and did approve this to be my last Will  
& testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand  
& Seal this Twentieth day of Nov<sup>r</sup> 1702

Governor and Mr Thomas Dale and made oath they saw this  
Signed Sealed and declared by the said Thomas Moore

And on y<sup>e</sup> back of the said Will was this Endorsed  
Aug<sup>r</sup> 4<sup>th</sup> 1702 And Wm Moore into y<sup>e</sup> Court of the said  
Province y<sup>e</sup> within will of Thomas Moore heretofore made and  
declared that y<sup>e</sup> said Will was made by the Consent and at the  
said day dated it may be proved and entered in y<sup>e</sup> records of  
the Province Court And Richard Spragg Com<sup>r</sup> to take y<sup>e</sup> probate  
thereof to W<sup>m</sup> the Governor & The Deale was well granted & accordingly  
proved
