Perkins as Principal together with Henry Honey and James Hamard as securities acknowledge themselves to owe and stand justly indebted unto the State of Maryland, for the just and full sum of twenty pounds current money to be made and levied of their Bodies, goods and Chattels, Lands and tenements, respectively for the use of the said State. The Condition of the above recognizance is such that if the above bound Thomas R. Perkins shall well and truly observe perform, fulfill and keep the act of Assembly granting liberty to persons to retail spirituous Liquors, and in every respect conform thereto, then this recognizance to be void, else to be and remain in full force and virtue in Law.
