ure and belonging to a certain Joseph T. Mitchell of Kent County in the State of Maryland aforesaid, to have and to hold all and singular the said goods and chat-  
tels above bargained and sold or mentioned and intended to be to the said Andrew Galley his executors administrators and assigns forever, we the said Totten and Stoughton for ourselves our executors and administrators all
