

2nd Because the Verdict is against the weight of Evidence
3rd Because the Verdict is without any evidence on the
part of the Petitioners to prove that Negro Sucks
under whom the Petitioners claim was a free woman
in Virginia -

Whereupon all and singular
the premises aforesaid being by the Court here given heard
and fully understood, and mature deliberation thereon
had for that it seems to the Court here, that the said
Verdict for the reasons aforesaid set forth ought not
to be set aside - Therefore it is considered by the Court
here that the said Amy Hemsley, Susan Hemsley, Julian
Hemsley and Priscilla Hemsley the Petitioners aforesaid never
lost their freedom of and against the said George Walls and
that they be free and discharged of and from the service
of the said George Walls and that the said Amy Hemsley
Susan Hemsley, Julian Hemsley and Priscilla Hemsley
as therof freed and discharged without day and so forth

It is also considered by the Court here that the said Amy
Hemsley, Susan Hemsley, Julian Hemsley and Priscilla Hemsley
recover against the said George Walls the sum of twenty four
Dollars and fifty one Cents and two thirds of a Cent by the Court
here unto the said Amy Hemsley, Susan Hemsley, Julian
Hemsley and Priscilla Hemsley adjudged on their account
for their Art and Charges by them about their prosecution
of this action aforesaid laid out and expended and
that they have therof their Execution and so forth -

withdrew from the bar of the Court here, the

said George Walls by his said Attorney, tendered to the Court
here the following bills of Exceptions and which were
by the Court here signed and sealed and which are inform
following towid -

Amy Hemsley and others v Petition for Freedom

George E. Walls -

All the Trial of this Cause
the Petitioners proved by
Grenberg Griffis that some time before the surrender of York
Town to the American Army he the said Griffis had gone to
James River with one Captain James Sweat, that he was after
wards transferred to the Baltimore Gally and after the
surrender of the British he again went on Board Captain
Sweats Vessel and went in to York River - That about two
or three Weeks after the ^{said} Surrender he left York Town
That about two weeks before he left York Town he had
been on shore at Gosport where he had seen Negro Sucks the
Mother of Amy one of the petitioners selling cakes and beer
without Control and that he saw her repeatedly afterwards
selling cakes and beer at the shore of the River at York Town
until the day before Captain Sweat sailed when the said
Sucks was brought on board Captain Sweat's Vessel by five
ape men at about 9 O'Clock at Night and purchased by
the said Sweat that another black Woman was brought on
board Captain Sweat's Vessel by the same persons who was
released and set on shore in consequence of her cries and
screams - that the said James Sweat had informed the said
Negro Sucks that he would make her his wife that the
said Sucks had said during her passage to Maryland that
