

In the Name of God Amen I Philomon Lloyd Chew do make this my last Will and Testament ¹⁵ March 1770. I give and devise ^{unto God} Philip Thomas and his Heirs (the son of Philip Thomas of West River) all that Tract of Land called and known by the name of Sharpes Island. I give and bequeath unto Margaret Bordley and Mary Paca my two Sisters and to their Heirs for ever all my Real Estate except what is before devised my intention and Will is that they shall possess in fee simple my said Real Estate as Tenants in Common paying each of them five hundred pounds Sterling Money to my Brother Bennett Chew. I give and bequeath to my Brother Bennett Chew One thousand Pounds Current Money out of my Personal Estate and the residue I give and bequeath unto my two Sisters Margaret Bordley and Mary Paca they first paying to Philip Thomas son of Phillip of West River five hundred Pounds Current Money. Thereby appoint Bennett Chew and William Paca Executors of this my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year above Written.
