I give and devise to my dear Daughter H. M. Addison, and the Heirs  
of her Body my Plantation and Lands on Severn River which I bought of  
Nathan Waters and I give and devise to my said Daughter the follow-  
ing Negroes viz. Tye, Nell, Lem, Frank, Lach, Maria and Sal which he-  
goes are belonging to and employed on said plantation and I give and  
devise to my said Daughter all the Horses Cattle & other Stock on said  
Plantation Subject Nevertheless to the Incumbrance of a certain Instru-  
ment of Writing or Written Contract purporting to be a Deed of the  
Premises for a limited time and under a certain Limitation as to the  
Duration of the Interest meant to be paid by the said Deed which  
is written by me and dated the 27<sup>th</sup> Aug 1796 and I do hereby confirm  
the said Written Contract. and I devise to the person therein mention-  
ed all the Interest meant and express to be paid by the said Instru-  
ment of Writing for and during the Time therein mentioned ~

And in Addition to the Property in Effects & Money which I have  
given already to my said Daughter before making of this Will, I do  
hereby give and devise to her fifteen hundred pounds Current Money  
to be paid her in three Annual Payments: the first Payment to be  
made twelve Months after my Death but no Interest to be paid on either  
annual payment but from the Day of failure, on which it ought to be  
paid ~

I confirm my gift of Negro Betty to my Niece Betty Paca, and I give  
and devise to each of my Nieces Priscilla, Nancy & Fanny Paca a  
Negroe girl to be chosen for each of them by my Son John, Neither of  
the said Negroe girls to exceed twelve years of Age: these Negroes to be  
delivered them whenever my Son John thinks they will be useful to them  
but to be delivered at all Events on their respective Marriages ~

All the rest of my Estate real and personal I give and devise to my  
said dear Son John Philemon Paca and his Heirs, and I hereby appoint

him my Executor revoking all other Wills heretofore made by me. In Wit-
