Was not Mr. Thomas intimate at the late Mr. S. Chews, and of ten visited there?

When did m. Thomas die of what age was the? Whether she or Mr. Helburn was the eldest sister?

Ineverdid hear from my mother or any of my ancestors that Margaret was a descendant of an Indian Woman, and I never did hear any thing of an Indian Girl being brought up in P. Sloy of family. Mry mother the late Anne Thomas was intimately acquiented with the late Samuel Chew of Herring bay, and has visited him there. He frequently visited her at West view. And Thomas died in May 1977 a good swenty. The was closer than her sister the late Mary Stepburn.
