It is remembered, that on this eighth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty nine, the following Deed, or Instrument of writing was received to be recorded and is accordingly enrolled as follows, to wit: This Deed, made this fifth day of October, in the year Eighteen hundred and fifty eight - by Reverend Robert Lloyd Goldsborough and Fanny Goldsborough, his wife, of Middletown, in New Castle County in the State of Delaware, Witnesseth, that for and in consideration of the sum of five hundred and ninety One dollar, Sixty Seven Cents Current money, the said Robert Lloyd Goldsborough and Fanny Goldsborough, his wife, do grant unto Henry H. Goldsborough, all and singular their undivided interest, being one sixth part of, in and to that farm or plantation heretofore known as "Canada's Addition" or "Canada's Mezzard" and part of "Four Square Resurvey," by the name or names of the same what it may, that is situated about four miles or thereabouts from the town of Castro, on the main public road, leading from Castro to the Chapel in Talbot County and State of Maryland, commencing for the same within a few yards from Wottenhanks bridge, on the divisional line between said farm and the lands of one Samuel Williams, and running from thence with the main public road leading from Castro to the Chapel, until you come to the meadow lately sold by Benjamin Richardson to Alexander Mackay, and then with Mackay's meadow & the meadows heretofore sold to different persons by Henry H.
