That she is the mother of a negro
boy named Charles Wether - who is
an infant - under twenty one years
of age. That the father of said Charles
is dead, and she has the management
and control of the said infant.

Your petition further represents
that the said infant, Charles, is now
in the possession of Samuel Griffin
of Talbot County, and has been for the
last twelve months, - who refuses
to deliver up the said boy to her - or to
the person to whom she claims him
to belong for the year 1866 -

Your petition claims that she is
entitled as the mother of said infant, to
have the custody and control of said
infant, and manage and direct his
services.

Your petition therefore prays you
Honor to grant unto her the Writ of
Habeas Corpus, against the said Samuel
Griffin, commanding ^{him} to be and appear, with
said Charles, before your Honor on some
day, to be therein named, to show cause why
the said infant should not be delivered into
the custody and care of your petitioner.
