Be it remembered that the following Instrument of writing was Re-  
corded the thirtieth day of March Seventeen hundred (and ninety five) to wit  
(Dorchester) County, to wit. Thereby Certify all whom it doth or may  
concern that on the eighteenth day of March A. Domini 1795. I remo-  
ved into this State of Maryland, a Negro boy Jack, a slave, and  
a Negro girl Sarah, a slave, from the State of (Delaware) for my own  
use and benefit and not for sale, and that said Negroes were late-  
ly remov'd from this State by virtue of an Act of Assembly into the  
State of (Delaware), made for that express purpose, which Negroes were  
given me by my father Ino Goldborough of the County aforesaid and are
