**ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY DOLLARS
REWARD.**—Ran away on Tuesday last, from my farm in Prince George's county, a negro slave named **JOE**, aged 39 years, about five feet ten inches high. His complexion is dark, not black, stammers in conversation, and stoops a little. He had on and took with him a great coat of drab colored coarse cloth, two short coats of country cloth, kersey of a light color, pantaloons of the same, and some other clothing. He has a brother named Tom, who belonged to Mr. Ritchie, of Frederick, since deceased; another brother named Phil, who belonged to Mr. Kennedy, of Baltimore. Tom, it has been said, now resides in Baltimore; he is a freeman. Joe will probably go to Frederick or Baltimore.

The above reward will be promptly paid to any person who will take him up and deliver him to me, or confine him in jail so that I get him again.
