RANAWAY, from the subscriber on Sunday night, the 26th inst. three Negroes to wit: **L. LEWIS**, supposed to be about twenty five years old, five feet ten inches high, of a black complexion, has a very bad countenance—face rather sharp, with thick lips. He was purchased a few years since of Maj. Richard Jones of the city Annapolis.

JOHN DRAKE—Is about twenty-one or two years old—say five feet nine inches high, is a lively looking, stout made fellow, of a bright complexion, talks with his mouth partly shut, and has a pleasant countenance.

EMORY DRAKE—He is brother to John, very much of his complexion and features, talks like him with his mouth also partly shut—is say five feet high, and about sixteen years of age. It is not known that said negroes took any clothing with them, except what they had on, which was a shirt, drab cloth jacket and linen trowsers.

John and Emory's mother is a free mulatto woman by the name of Hannah, and resides in Baltimore, where it is supposed they may have gone, having taken a sail boat of Mr. Thos. J. Sherwood's of the adjoining farm. She is twenty feet long, painted black with a yellow stripe three or four inches wide, dividing the black. The above reward will be given if taken out of the State, but one hundred and fifty dollars if taken in the State, and lodged in jail in the city of Baltimore or Easton, Md. so that I get them again.
