TRUNAWAYS AND ABRESTS.—The Cambridge Eagle says on Thursday hight seven negroes ran away from near town, as follows: negro man, aged about thirty, belonging to James E. Hall, Esq.; negro boy, aged seventeen, apprentice until twenty-one; negro girl aged fifteen; two negro boys, one aged thirteen and the other eleven, belonging to Hon. F. P. Phelps. In company was the mother of the children, who had just obtained her freedom, with her child aged ten months. On Saturday night they were arrested in Caroline county, and early on Sunday morning safely lodged in Cambridge jail. The negroes, it is thought, were making for the Delaware shore, where they would have taken a boat for New Jersey. It is said that they had a white guide a part of the way.
