

ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS REWARD.—Ran away from the subscriber, living in Prince George's county, Maryland, near Good Luck Post Office, on the 15th day of April, 1840, a negro girl named JANE TAYLOR. She may have changed her name, as she wanted a free negro for her husband who calls himself Henry Botler, a brick-moulder by trade, and who has been living at the Savage Factory, Anne-Arundel county; has since left there, and supposed to be in Baltimore; and it is probable she has made her way to him, as she was seen taking passage in the cars at Beltsville. She was living with Mr. Thomas Lansdall, Savage Factory, Anne Arundel county; had on when she absconded a calico dress, straw bonnet, and dark shawl. Jane is about five feet high, very likely, and of fine countenance, full suit of hair, and a fine yellow complexion; she has had the small-pox, which shows very plain at this time, and is about twenty-one years of age.

Officers of Baltimore city will look out, as I will give the above reward if taken any distance over ten miles from home, and twenty-five dollars if taken under that distance, and brought home to me, or secured in jail so that I get her again.
