
The Princess Anne is escorted into Centreville's Court House Square by Acting Governor Blair Lee, III.




The Royal couple arrive at Wye Plantation.



A lecture by Sir Patrick Dean at the Chesapeake Bay Model at Stevensville began Queen Anne's Day. Sir Patrick is chairman of the English-Speaking Union of the Commonwealth and former British Ambassador to the United States.

Sponsored by the Queen Anne's County Historical Society, the lecture is a regular part of the annual Queen Anne's Day celebration. In addition to Sir Patrick's address, the program included a concert by the Queen Anne's County High School Concert Band, the Gunston School Glee Club, and the Queen Anne's County High School Choir.

The County Commissioners presided over the Queen Anne's Day County Meeting, one of the principal events of the annual celebration.

Located in a different town each year, the County Meeting includes an address recalling the history of the host community and the presentation of awards to members of the community for outstanding public service.

The Crowning Point of Queen Anne's Day 1977 was the unveiling of a statue of Queen Anne by Her Royal Highness The Princess Anne. Located in the court house square in Centreville, the statue was a Bicentennial gift to Queen Anne's County from Wye Institute. It is the only known statue of Queen Anne outside Great Britain.



The Princess reviewed the Queen Anne's Day Boat Parade at Kent Island. She saw a display of Chesapeake Bay work boats and classic sailing craft.







The Princess and Capt. Phillips attended services at Old Wye Episcopal Church in Wye Mills.



At Queenstown, The Princess planted a pin oak at the site of the original Queen Anne's County court house.







The Princess Anne presented trophies to winners of the equestrian events at the Queen Anne's Day Invitational Horse Show, held at Gunston School near Centreville.
