Know all men by these presents that we the within named applicants being citizens of the United States, and a majority of whom, are citizens of the State of Maryland, and desiring to form a corporation for the objects and purposes hereinafter set forth under an act of the General Assembly of the State of Maryland passed at the January Session of 1868, Chapter 471 entitled "An Act to Repeal Article 26 of the Code of Public General Laws, and to enact a substitute therefor, and to repeal Section 22 of Article 16 Sections 99 to 103 of the same Article, and Sections 33 to 43 of Article 88 of the Code of Public General Laws" in pursuance of the provisions of said Act; and for the purpose aforesaid, make, sign, seal and acknowledge the following Certificate in writing to wit.

We do hereby certify, that we John Henry Evans, Washington Binley, David Humlock, James Brown, Samuel Spry, Charles McCallister, Francis Johns, Charles Edgar Bradley, and William Emory Temple applicants, residing in Queen Anne's County, State of Maryland, do hereby form a Corporation under the name, and style of "The Church Hill Cemetery Association of Queen Anne's County" that the term of existence of the said Corporation is limited to forty years, and that the said Corporation is formed upon the articles, conditions, and provisions, herein expressed, and that subject in all respects, and particulars, to the limitations, relating to corporations which are contained in the General Laws of the State of Maryland.

We do further certify, that the object and purpose of said Corporation, is the providing and establishing a Cemetery, or place of interment for the dead, and of adequately securing, preserving, adorning, and embellishing, the said grounds thereof as a Cemetery, that the ground

purchased, held, or used, for the purposes of burial shall not exceed two acres in extent, and the same shall by said Directors, of said Corporation be laid off in burial lots, and walks, and roads, as they shall deem proper, and that said lots for the purpose of burial therein, and that interments in the same, shall be obtained, and made on the terms, conditions, and regulations, that may be from time to time fixed, and established, by the Directors, of said Corporation, and among the same shall be regulations, prescribing the manner in which burial lots shall be marked, and bounded (whenever the lot holder shall decline to mark, and bound, the same) and the quantity, and quality, of the shrubbery to be planted in the said lots, and the annual tax or sum to be paid by each lot holder if any shall be paid, and the same to be paid, for digging, filling, and walling graves.

We do further certify, that the operations, of the said Corporation are to be carried on, in Queen Anne's County, State of Maryland, and that, its principal office shall be located, in the town of Church Hill, in said County, and State, and that the aggregate capital stock, of the said Corporation shall be one hundred thousand dollars, and that the said capital stock, shall be divided into one hundred and twenty shares of the par value, of twenty five dollars each, and the said Directors by a two thirds concurring vote, of their entire number, shall have the right to direct, and authorize, the sale, and issue of said stock, from time to time, and in such quantities, as they may deem, necessary, to effectuate the object, and purpose of said Corporation.

On motion the President was ordered, to name a committee of five to select a lot of not less than ten acres of a Cemetery within the village of Church Hill, or not more than a quarter of a mile from it; the following Gentlemen were selected, W. & Temple, James Brown, David Hurlock, Charles E. Bradley, Charles McColister. The Committee to meet on Friday July 21st at 9 o'clock A. M. at the village, to perform said duty, and to report to the meeting the next

day. On motion the meeting adjourned to meet on
 Saturday 22nd of July, at nine o'clock, A.M.

 purchased by him from J. H. Dill, the said
 being situated on the public road between
 the upper and lower ends of the Village, and the said
 ten acres to be selected by us, at and for the sum of
 sixty dollars, (\$60) per acre, and the said Balliant
 also agrees to give to the said Cemetery Association
 for even the right of way, a road forty five feet wide
 from the public road to the land selected by said
 Committee, the said road to be located along the
 divisions line between the lands of J. Edwin Roberts
 heirs, and the lands of the said E. S. Balliant.

Rules & Regulations for The Church Hill Cemetery Association:

- 1 Applications for the purchase of burial Lots must be ^{made} to the Secretary, and on the payment of the purchase money a certificate will be delivered therefor, which will entitle the holder to all the rights and privileges conferred by the act of incorporation, before which no interment or occupancy will be permitted.
- 2 All revenue arising from digging or bricking graves or from other work done by the Corporation for lot owners together with the proceeds of sale of lots, and all other income of the Corporation shall be subject to the control of the Board of Directors and shall be applied by them to the payment of all legitimate and proper expenses including such dividend to Stock Holders as the directors ^{may deem proper} and the surplus, if any to be applied to the creation of a fund for the future maintenance and decoration of the Cemetery grounds.
- 3 All graves shall be dug at least six inches within the lines of the lot.
- 4 All graves shall be dug and bricking done by workmen in the employ.

unless otherwise directed by the ^{Executive} ~~Committee~~ ^{Committee} of the corporation, all brick and lime necessary in bricking any grave will be furnished by the corporation and no charges will be greater than the prices charged in the neighborhood for such work and materials. All charges to be paid when the grave is ordered.

5 All sodding or other work done by individual Lot owners shall be under the direction of the ~~directors~~ ^{Executive Committee} ~~or persons~~ appointed by them for that purpose.

6 Every Lot owner shall pay to the treasurer of the Corporation 50 cts pr. year for each Lot owned by him and ~~10 cts pr. year~~ additional for each grave in said lot, ~~The same to be used in keeping the cemetery grounds in order and as far as the amount will justify, in keeping ^{in order} and decorating the ^{lots} graves.~~

7 The prices of Lots shall be \$20⁰⁰ for all Lots on the main wide drives and 15⁰⁰ for all other, a lot to be 16 ft square. Single graves from 1⁰⁰ to 3⁰⁰. All Lots must be satisfactorily settled for before the ground is broken or the certificate given. No sale or transfer of any Lot will be valid without the permission of the Board of Directors

attested by the secretary, who shall enter the same on the books of the Corporation. Five percent of the purchase money for such sale or transfer shall be paid to the Corporation. No Lot-holder will be allowed to demand or receive any compensation ^{for burial} in his or her lot.

8 } Ownership of Lots consists in the right of interment. They can be used for no other purpose, and can not be divided. Should a Lot-holder die without a devise or any known kindred, said Lot shall revert to the Corporation.

9 All persons while in the Cemetery grounds, ~~shall~~ ^{must} keep in the walks, and not handle any flowers, shrubs, trees or other ornaments of the Cemetery. All driving must be in a walk and no horse must be left unattended without being hitched to a suitable post provided for the purpose or in charge of some suitable person. Nothing in this section is to be construed so as to prevent Lot-owners from entering on their Lots, or any one from entering on Lots for burial purposes, or workmen in the discharge of their duty.

10. The right is reserved to the Board of Directors to plant all trees and to remove any thing

they may think wears or obstructs the general beauty of the grounds or which they may deem otherwise injurious or dangerous.

11 Owners of lots may erect any suitable stone monument or other sepulchral structure or enclosure, or cutthroat shrubs plants or trees, so as not to disturb the rights and privileges of others, nor to detract from the general beauty of the grounds. Any such plants, becoming by roots, branches or otherwise detrimental or unsightly, the Corporation shall have the right to remove the same.

12 Owner of lots or single graves will ~~have~~ ^{be accorded} access to the Cemetery grounds at all proper times, but shall observe the rules laid down for visitors provided this shall not prevent entrance upon their own lots.

13 No disinterment will be allowed without the permission of the Board of Directors.

14 All workmen employed by lot holders must be under the supervision of the ~~Board of Directors~~ ^{Executive Committee} ~~and the Board of Directors reserve~~ ^{to the executive committee} the right to prohibit any one objectionable to them on account of any former violation of rules, from entering the grounds either as workman or visitor and ~~also the right~~ ^{to hereby confer upon the superintendent} to expel from the grounds any one violating the rules of the Corporation.

Sect. 2^d The regular meeting of the stockholders shall be held on or before the 10th day of December in each year, and a meeting of the Board of Directors shall be held whenever desired by the President or requested by any three members of the Board in writing, the Board of Directors shall make a full report of the condition of the affairs of the corporation to the stockholders at their annual meeting each year—

Sect. 3^d The stockholders at their regular meeting shall elect nine directors who shall serve for the term of one year, or until their successors qualify and the said directors shall deliver up all property

of said Corporation, in their possession at the end of their Term to their successors in office,

Sect. 4 The Board of Directors shall meet within ten days after their election and elect from among their number a President Secretary and Treasurer, who shall be President Secretary and Treasurer of the Corporation, and shall each serve for one year,

Rule VI Every lot owner shall pay 50c per year for each lot owned by him or her for the keeping in proper condition the said lots. All lots must be satisfactorily settled for before ground is broken, or the certificate given. No sale or transfer of any lot will be valid without the permission of the Board of Directors, attested by the Secretary, who shall enter the same on the books of the corporation. Five per cent. of the purchase money for such sale or transfer shall be paid to the corporation. No lot holder will be allowed to demand or receive any compensation for burial in his or her lot.

Rule VIII Ownership of lots consists in the right of interment, they can be used for no other purpose, and cannot be divided. Should a lot holder die without a devise or any known kindred, said lot shall revert to the corporation.

Rule IX All persons while in the Cemetery Grounds must keep in the walks and not handle any flowers, shrubs, or other ornaments of the cemetery. All driving must be in a walk and no horse must be left without being hitched to a post, provided for the purpose, or in charge of some suitable per-

son. Nothing in this section is to be construed so as to prevent lot owners from entering on lots for burial purposes, or workmen in this discharge of their duty.

Rule X The right is reserved to the board of Directors to plant all trees and to remove anything they may think mars or obstructs the general beauty of the grounds, or which they may deem otherwise injurious or dangerous.

Rule XI Owners of lots may erect any suitable stone, monument or other sepulchral structure or enclosure, or cultivate shrubs, plants or trees so as not to disturb the rights and privileges of others, nor to detract from the general beauty of the grounds; any such plants, becoming by roots, branches or otherwise detrimental or unsightly, the corporation shall have the right to remove the same.

Rule XII Owners of lots or single graves will be allowed access to the cemetery grounds at all proper times, but shall observe the rules laid down for visitors, provided this shall not prevent entrance upon their own lots.

Rule XIII No disinterment will be allowed without the permission of board of Directors.
