sites, and that he bought with the understanding that it was at the option of the proprietors either to erect water works for themselves, or sell their several sites which could be supplied with water only from the canal by aqueducts communicating with these sites, and over these incisions in the banks of the canal a bridge must be placed:

The counter memorialist states, that the profit of his establishment will be impaired by granting the prayer of the petitioners; a cursory view of the bill herewith presented must remove this objection, even if it were not embraced in the class of *damna absque injuria*. From the consideration of other matter presented in the memorial the minority of the committee would, in the most respectful manner, ask to be excused, and beg leave to present the following bill.

A bill entitled, an act supplementary to an act entitled, an act for making the river Susquehanna navigable from the line of this state to tide water; which was read the first time.
