

**WESTERN SHORE TREASURY,**  
Annapolis, January 11, 1834.

To the Honourable,

*The House of Delegates.*

The Treasurer of the western shore, in obedience to their order of the 6th inst., submits the following statement:—

In 1824.

\$1,000 were paid to Jeremiah Hughes, for printing the laws and the votes and proceedings of December session, 1823—and

\$1982.18, were placed to his credit on the journal of accounts, for printing and stationary, for the Senate and House of Delegates,—how much *for printing* or *for stationary*, does not appear.

In 1825.

\$800 were paid to Jonas Green, for printing the votes and proceedings.

\$485 were paid to Jeremiah Hughes, for printing the Laws and Resolutions.

\$81 were placed to the credit of Jonas Green—and

1965.06½ were placed to the credit of Jere. Hughes,—on the journal of accounts—but for what does not appear.

What other payments for public printing, were made in those two years, may not be learned from the books in this department—nor the aggregate cost of it.

In 1826.

\$1815 were paid to Jonas Green, for printing the votes and proceedings.

\$427.87 were paid to Jeremiah Hughes, for printing the Laws, &c.

\$239 were placed to the credit of Jonas Green—and

2400 do do to the credit of Jeremiah Hughes—on the journal of accounts—without stating for what.

\$1221.50, were paid for other public printing—of which
