

REPORT

ON THE

STATE'S TOBACCO WAREHOUSES.

The Committee appointed by an order of the House of Delegates, to proceed to the city of Baltimore, and examine the condition of the several Tobacco Inspection Warehouses, beg leave respectfully to report:

That in obedience to the order of your honorable body, they did proceed to the city of Baltimore, and made the examination required.

No. 1, is a large newly erected building, of brick, substantially constructed, in good repair, capable of containing three thousand hogsheads of tobacco; at which there was inspected, during the last year, four thousand hogsheads.

No. 2, adjoining to No. 1, both situated on Dugan's and McDonald's wharf, is also a large well constructed brick building, capable of containing three thousand hogsheads; at which there was inspected, the last year, about six thousand hogsheads. Your Committee are of opinion, that it will be necessary to repair the upper floor of the North end of this building.

No. 3, situated on Light Street Wharf, is also a large, well constructed, building of brick, capable of containing three thousand hogsheads; and there was inspected during the last year, eight thousand three hundred and thirty-five hogsheads.

Your Committee, are unanimously of opinion, that the interest of the State would not be promoted, at the present time, by concentrating the Warehouses on Dugan's and McDonald's wharf. Should Ware-
