

Richard Lemmon, Robert Barry and James Cheston, Commissioners under the act, passed by both branches of the Legislature of Maryland at December session, 1835, entitled, "an act to provide indemnity to the sufferers by certain riots in the city of Baltimore," having examined and ascertained by "view and by such proof as they deem competent and sufficient," do make to the Treasurer of the Western Shore this return of damages sustained by the claimants as hereinafter stated, viz:—

<i>Charles Richardson,</i> the sum of sixteen dollars and forty-two cents,	16 42
