## THE NEW TOBACCO WAREHOUSE.

Gentlemen of the Senate and  
of the House of Delegates:

We herewith lay before you a report of the gentlemen employed by the Executive, to superintend the building of a new Tobacco Inspection Warehouse. Upon examination of the law providing for building the warehouse, we do not think that it authorises us to have the new street paved, or the pavement of the old streets repaired; and as it is manifest that the warehouse cannot be conveniently used until this work is done, we submit the matter for your consideration, and such action upon it as you may think proper.

Gentlemen—

In conformity with our duty we have the honor of laying before you an account of the monies expended by us up to the 30th Dec. ult., in the erection of the new Tobacco Warehouse, situated on the corner of Charles and Conway streets, in the city of Baltimore.

By it you will perceive that the amount expended is \$10,949 43, up to the 30th December, exceeding our estimate of \$57,500 in the sum of \$3,449 13; and we have to state that it will require \$2,422 to complete the paving of the street on the property purchased of the estate of Mr. Jno. Donnell, and to repair that on Charles and Conway streets.
