difference of data between us is nothing more nor less than a difference of opinion; Mr. T rimbles experience and observation and information in regard to canals and the amount of drainage that can be made available from a given surface leading him to one conclusion—ours on the contrary leading to another. Mr. Trimble's survey therefore verifys the assertion made by us in our report; that no one could go into the field with our opinions of drainage and find the Seneca route practicable with due supply of water.
