Ordered by the House of Delegates, That the Governor be requested to inform this House of the amount of public money expended in the survey and location of the Eastern Shore Rail Road, and its several branches; and of the amount paid to each person employed in surveying and locating the same, and for what service; and if from any cause the said information cannot be furnished before the close of the present session, then the Governor is requested to cause the same to be published in two newspapers on the Eastern Shore.
