Would it be More Profitable to Raise Aye instead of Oats for Feeding! I would say not, if the farmers will raise the right kind of pate. We have here, in North Carolina, \$50 Egyptian pats. We sow them in September, and they stand the winter as well as rye, and mature about the middle of June (about the same time of seeding and harvesting

mature about the middle of June (about the same time of seeding and harvesting as our tye.)
