REPUBLICAN JOURNAL.—The Republicans of Springfield, Illinois, (the home of Lincoln) have a grand jubilee on the 1st of August, which occasion numerous speeches were made. The speech of Mr. Trumbull, in view of his high position and influential relations to Lincoln, is taken as a reflex of the views of Lincoln.

Upon national topics Mr. Trumbull disconcerted the idea of triumphing over political opponents, accepting all, by whatever name called, as brethren of a common country. He said Mr. Lincoln, although the candidate of the republicans party, as chief magistrate will neither belong to that nor any other party which is inaugurated. He will be the President of the country, and of the whole industry; and I doubt not will be ready to defend and protect the State in which he has not received a solitary vote against any encroachment upon its constitutional privileges, as the one in which he has received the largest majority. While they by whose votes he has been designated as chief magistrate of the people will expect him to maintain and carry forward the principles on which he was elected, they know that in doing so no encroachments will be made on the reserved rights of any of the States. They know that the federal government is one of delegated powers; that it can do nothing except the authority for the act can be found in the instrument which created it; that all powers not conferred are reserved to the States or the people of the States. Hence when their political opponents have charged them with abolitionism, or attributed to them a desire to interfere with slavery in the States, or some fanatic has insisted they ought to do so, the reply has invariably been that the people, who made the federal government, did not think proper to confer on such authority; and it has, therefore, no more right to meddle with slavery in a Southern state than it does to干涉 with a sedan in Russia. Nor are the principal non-slaveholding States in any way responsible for slavery in the States which tolerate it, because as to that question they are as foreign from each other as independent governments.

After intimating that if South Carolina, or any other seceding State, should withdraw itself by force of arms, the constituted authorities of the Union, they will be met with a determined purpose to preserve the Union, Mr. Trumbull concluded as follows:

Should any republican inquire what has been gained by the triumph of republicanism, I answer much. We have gained a decision of the people in favor of a Pacific railroad, a homestead policy—a judiciary trial—the admission into the Union of Kansas as a free State—a reform in the financial department of the government—and more important than all, the verdict of the people—the surest of power, and from whose decision there is no appeal, that the constitution is not a slavery-extending instrument. No more Dred Scott decisions will now be made. Persons, both of the North and of the South, will hereafter be protected in all their constitutional rights. The policy of the government, as of old, will now set in favor of freedom, and not for the supremacy of slavery, as has been the case for the last six years. Freedom is born with the tax of the territories, because the people, in their majority, have so ordered, and neither courts nor Congresses will be able to thwart their will.

Mr. Trumbull spoke at length against the right of secession, and declared that it was unjust to charge Mr. Breckinridge and any number of his friends as disunionists.

ALLEGED BURIALS OF A SEA CAPTAIN.—Captain Harley, of the British ship Culloiden, recently arrived at Mobile, Ala., with passengers from Liverpool, was alleged to have treated his passengers with great cruelty, especially Miss Mary McDonald, whom he caused to be beaten with a rope and drenched with water, on several occasions. A demonstration having been made to the Captain, some prominent gentlemen of Mobile had him taken to jail for safe keeping. A public meeting held at the Circuit Court-room on the 9th inst. passed resolutions branding Capt. Harley a cowardly, brutal and cruel man, deserving the execrations of the world, and calling on the British Consul to require the owners of the ship to dismiss Harley from their employ, and appealing to all ship owners to refuse to employ him. Also warning Captain Harley that he must never return to Mobile. A military company was called out to protect the jail.

THE VOTERS IN NAPLES.—On the morning of the election in Naples, Garibaldi went early to vote for annexation. He afterwards appeared at the balcony of the Hotel d'Inghilterra, and made a brief speech, ending with the popular gesture, which consists in raising the right hand with the forefinger only extended. It means One Italy. Two English girls were at his side, wearing sailor jackets, the Garibaldi uniform.—All the employees of the old Government voted for annexation. In Procida also, the majority voted for annexation.
