The excitement wasgreat, he told the President; the people of all classes were failly aroused, and it was impossible for any one to answer for the consequences of the presence of northern troops anywhere within our borders. He reminded the President also that the jurisdiction of their city authorities was confined to their own population and that he could give no promises for the people elsewhere, because he would be unable to keep them of given.

The dispatch was submitted.
