SUMMARY OF WAR NEWS

The subjoined summary of War News for the past week, we take from the Baltimore Gazette:

FRIDAY, Dec. 12.—The news from General Burnside's army is quieting. During the night of Wednesday the positions were carried to the river, and 143 pieces of artillery were in position opposite Fredericksburg. At five o'clock yesterday morning the Confederates opened a murderous fire on the Union army from the heights on the east bank of the river. An hour later General Burnside ordered all the guns to be opened up to the hour of closing the despatch. The city was fired in several places and it is probable that it will eventually be entirely destroyed. General Franklin commanded a brigade three miles below the city, on which his division crossed, while directly opposite the town the troops were all under arms. At noon the Confederates again opened their fire on the bridge builders. Up to that time the Federal loss in killed and wounded was not known.

The latest reports from General Grant's army inform us that the Confederates have occupied the Federal troops. At half past four o'clock yesterday two bridges were directly opposite the city. The Confederates were not far from having been driven back when the Federal troops suddenly began to cross the river. The Federal loss in killed and wounded amounts to one thousand, while the Confederate loss is fully double that number. Extensive hospitals have been improvised at Fayetteville for the sick and wounded. The Confederates are said to have mutilated their pieces and moved off in the night, continuing their retreat to Van Buren, Arkansas. Col. McCalland of the 10th Iowa was killed, and Col. Black of the 37th Illinois and Major Thomas of the 20th Iowa, together with a large number of soldiers, were wounded on the Federal side.

Saturday, Dec. 13.—The despatches of yesterday indicate that the advance portions of the Army of Gen. Burnside, having just possession of the heights on the east bank of the river, are as the result of the hot contest and bombardment of that day, they are generally moving across the heights on the east bank of the river, and are occupying the river front on the night of the 13th.
