Barren Practi Trees - Seeing an inquiry in the "Dollar Newspapt", February 18th, wishing to know how to make barren peach trees bear, I will give the inquirer the benefit of my experience and observation: In the spring, as soon as the frost is out of the ground, take a spade and cut a ring around the tree, by putting the spade the whole length of the blade in the ground, two, three, four or five feet from the trunk, according to the size of the tree. If that does not produce the desired effect, the next spring cut another one nearer the tree, taking care hot to come so near as to cut too many of the roots. When the tree is very thrifty, cut off a part of the last year's growth. I will warrant your tree to bear if it is thrifty. I have tried this remedy and seen it tried, and never knew it to fail.
