**ASSESSMENT ACT.**

MARYLAND, SCT: At an Extra Session of the General Assembly of Maryland, begun and held at the city of Annapolis, on the 13th day of January, 1866, the following Act, entitled "An Act to amend the Act relating to the assessment of property in this State, passed on the 13th day of February, 1865," was passed, and enacted, to have effect from the 1st day of March, 1866.

**CHAPTER 157.** An Act to provide for the General Valuation and Assessment of property in this State. Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, that all property, real, personal, and mixed, of all kinds and descriptions, in this State, shall be liable to valuation and assessment, and shall be chargeable with taxes according to the provisions of this Act.

**SECTION 2.** And be it enacted, That to facilitate and expedite the assessments, Baltimore County shall be divided into five Assessment Districts, upon the basis of the present divisions of the County into Wards, whereof Wards numbers one, two, three and four shall constitute the first, second, third, fourth and fifth Assessment District, respectively; and Wards numbers five, six, seven and eight shall constitute the first, second, third and fourth Assessment District, respectively; and Wards numbers nine, ten and eleven shall constitute the first, second and third Assessment District, respectively; and Wards numbers twelve and thirteen shall constitute the first and second Assessment District, respectively; and Wards numbers fourteen, fifteen and sixteen shall constitute the first, second and third Assessment District, respectively; and Wards numbers seventeen, eighteen, nineteen and twenty shall constitute the first, second, third and fourth Assessment District, respectively.

**SECTION 3.** And be it enacted, That the Board of Assessors of Baltimore County shall be composed of five persons, to be appointed by the Board of Control and Review of Baltimore County, and each of whom shall be qualified to perform the duties of an Assessor for the assessment district composed of the property in his or her ward or wards; and they shall be sworn to and truly declare and affirm that they will faithfully discharge the duties of their office, and will render true and correct accounts of the assessments made by them, and of the amounts of taxes levied thereon, to the Board of Control and Review of Baltimore County, at such times and places as may be directed by the Board of Control and Review of Baltimore County.

**SECTION 4.** And be it enacted, That the Board of Assessors of Baltimore County shall be sworn to and truly declare and affirm that they will faithfully discharge the duties of their office, and will render true and correct accounts of the assessments made by them, and of the amounts of taxes levied thereon, to the Board of Control and Review of Baltimore County, at such times and places as may be directed by the Board of Control and Review of Baltimore County.
